Social/Emotional Definitions

Aggressive: Having a tendency to attack or do harm to others.

Agreement: The reaching or sharing of the same opinion or ideas that a person or group holds. A situation when everyone accepts the same terms.

Assertiveness: Having the confidence to state a position or say how you feel in a respectful way.

Compromise: The ability to settle and/or resolve a conflict by finding a solution both parties can agree upon.

Disagreement: Expressing a different opinion or having an argument about something., or a situation in which everyone does not accept the same terms.

Justice: Being fair in the way you approach situations or treat people.

Listening: Focusing attention to gather auditory information.

Problem-Solving: Ability to find creative solutions to conflicts and disagreements.
